Catholic Social Teaching (CST)

Catholic Social Teaching (CST) is the official teaching of the Church on the social order, on all dimensions of society including the economic and the political. At the core, the Catholic Social Teaching is the common good that is the good of the community. It is an essential part of the Catholic faith. There are seven Catholic Social Teaching (CST) principles; this week we will focus on the principle of **the Common good.**

The common good means that the fruits of the earth belong to everyone. No one should be excluded from the gifts of creation. Pope Paul VI spoke about this 50 years ago in his encyclical *Populorum Progressio*. The common good is about the social conditions necessary to bring the world closer to perfection or to bring God's kingdom closer on earth.

The common good is related to "social justice". In the original discussions of the idea of social justice in the nineteenth century, it was sometimes described as "common good justice". Social justice in the Catholic sense is not directly about the distribution of income or wealth but about actions that bring the common good closer to realisation.

In a global culture driven by excessive individualism, our tradition proclaims that the person is not only sacred but also social. How we organise our society in economics and politics, in law and policy directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. Our Church teaches that the role of the government and other institutions is to protect human life and human dignity and promote the common good.

Local individuals and groups can make a real difference. They are able to instil a greater sense of responsibility, a strong sense of community, a readiness to protect others, a spirit of creativity and a deep love for the land. Social problems must be addressed by community networks and not simply by the sum of individual good deeds. (Pope Francis, *On Care for Our Common Home* [Laudato Si'], nos. 179, 219)
